Irish Association of Advanced Nurse Midwife Practitioners (IAANMP)

Who are we?

The Irish Association of Advanced Nurse Midwife Practitioners (IAANMP) is a professional organisation dedicated to supporting and advancing the practice of advanced nurse and midwife practitioners in Ireland.

What do we do?

IAANMP provides advocacy, education, professional development, and networking opportunities for advanced nurse and midwife practitioners. We process personal data and special category personal data (sensitive data such as professional qualifications and employment details) to carry out this work.

Who do we process data about?

IAANMP processes data about its members, event participants, partners, and stakeholders in order to provide professional development, networking, and support services.

What kind of data is processed by us?

IAANMP processes personal data and special category personal data for the purpose of managing membership and professional services. We may process the following data:

- Name, address, telephone number, email, NMBI Pin
- Employment and professional qualifications
- Membership details
- Event participation records
- Payment details
- Photographs

Where did we get your data from?

We collect your data directly from you when you register for membership, sign up for events, or engage with our services. In some cases, employers or professional organisations may provide data on your behalf.

How do we process your data legally?

To provide professional services, IAANMP processes data on the following legal bases:

- **Legitimate interests (Article 6.1.f GDPR)** – Processing is necessary to manage membership, events, and professional activities.
- **Statutory obligation (Article 6.1.c GDPR)** – Where required by law or regulatory requirements.

- **Consent (Article 6.1.a GDPR)** – Where explicit consent is needed, such as for marketing communications or use of photographs.
- **Provision of professional services (Article 9.2.h GDPR)** – Special category data is processed as necessary for professional and career development purposes.

How long do we retain your data?

IAANMP retains personal and special category data for specific periods, including:

- Membership records: Retained for the duration of membership and up to five years after expiration.
- Event participation records: Retained for up to three years.
- Financial records: Retained for statutory periods as required by law.
- Data may be retained longer where necessary for legal, risk management, or regulatory purposes.

Where do we keep your data?

IAANMP stores digital personal data securely in compliance with GDPR.

Do we share your data?

IAANMP may share data with:

- Internal IAANMP committee officers for membership and service provision.
- External professional organisations, regulatory bodies, and employers when required.
- Third-party service providers for IT and administrative support, under strict data processing agreements.
- Legal and regulatory entities when required by law.

What are your rights?

Individuals have rights over their personal data under EU and Irish data protection law, including:

- Right to be informed
- Right of access
- Right to rectification
- Right to erasure (right to be forgotten)
- Right to restrict processing
- Right to object
- Right not to be subject to automated decision-making
- Right to data portability
